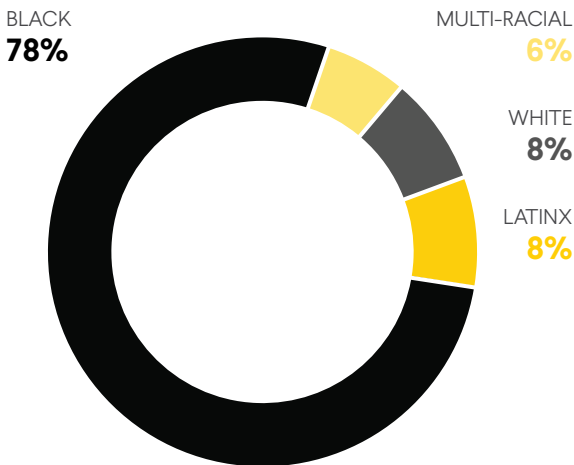

HIGHLIGHTS

- Supported families during the pandemic by offering virtual schooling. During this time, nearly 100% of students participated in iReady Testing (this includes virtual students who tested in-person at school). On average, 85% of students logged-in and engaged in virtual learning daily, and an increased number of students achieved the Honor Roll, 2020-21
- Brought the CCP community together through safe events such as Virtual School Dance & Drive-Thru Trick or Treat. Additionally sponsored 10 families by donating a full Thanksgiving meal and additional families with holiday gifts for students, 2020-21
- Improved Performance Index score by 12%, 2018-19
- Outperformed Cleveland Municipal School District on Performance Index and Value-Added, 2018-19
- Recipient of the ACCEL Gold Award for exceeding academic and enrollment goals, 2018-19
- Strong community partnerships including the Slavic Village Development, Scholastic Book Fair, Beech Brook & Family Solutions, and local barbers that provide free bi-weekly haircuts to students
- Offers 6% more instructional hours per year than the state's requirement for community schools
- According to the Spring 2021 ELA Ohio States Tests, sixth, seventh, and eighth grade scholars made more progress than expected, moderate evidence. This component measures Cleveland College Preparatory School scholars' progress as compared to the statewide expectation of growth.
- According to the Spring 2021 Math Ohio States Tests sixth grade scholars made more progress than expected, moderate evidence. Additionally, seventh grade scholars made more progress than expected, significant evidence. This component measures Cleveland College Preparatory School scholars' progress as compared to the statewide expectation of growth.
- According to the Improving At-Risk K-3 Readers component on the Ohio State Report Card Overview, 76.2% of first grade scholars were on-track.
- According to the Improving At-Risk K-3 Readers component on the Ohio State Report Card Overview, 64.3% of kindergarten scholars were on-track.
