






STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS






DISTRICTS OF RESIDENCE

HIGHLIGHTS

- Achieved a 15% year-over-year performance increase
- 100% of students met the state requirements for promotion to Grade 4
- Provided 1155 instruction hours, 26% more than the Ohio requirement for charter schools
- Campus improvements included new paint and banner in the foyer, new paint and flooring in gym & additional signage at front entrance
- Security updates included adding new cameras and Eagle Eye Network surveillance system
- Participated in NOCL non-profit sports program for Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball, Girls Volleyball & Cheerleading
- Won League Championship in Girls Volleyball & Girls Basketball!
- Hosted summer enrichment program in conjunction with NEO College Prep for students in Grades 3-7 focused on reading (ELA) math, social & emotional learning, and extracurricular options such as STEM, physical education, and the arts. Teachers used a scope and sequence to teach ELA and Math standards that were not mastered during the 2022-23 school year
- Initiated Student of the Month & Teacher of the Month recognition programs
- Expanded PBIS program implementation by offering prizes from classroom teachers and the school-wide merit store for positive behaviors, attendance & academic performance




ACADEMIC PROGRESS


Through a well-rounded curriculum that engages students, instructional hours above state requirements, and targeted interventions, Cleveland College Preparatory School continues steady academic recovery coming out of the pandemic. The school achieved an over 15% Performance Index (PI) score increase year-over-year.

Additionally, according to i-Ready results, 46% of students met the average growth level in Math for their grade level, with 87% growth being the average. Students in Grades 1, 2, 4 & 6 performed exceptionally well with over 100% progress made. Similarly, 42% of students met the average growth level in Reading for their grade level, with 79% growth being the average. Students in Grade 3 achieved over 100% progress.

YOY PERFORMANCE INDEX SCORE




PROGRESS COMPONENT RATINGS BY SUBJECT & GRADE LEVEL
